Insurance Deductible Grants and Interest-free, Deferred Roof Replacement Loans Available to Collier County Homeowners

Naples, Fla. --- Collier County is offering two programs to assist homeowners with repairs to their homes. For both programs, the property must be the applicant's primary residence and the home must be located within Collier County or the City of Naples, Everglades or Marco Island.

If Hurricane Ian damaged a homeowner's primary residence in Collier County and they need assistance with their insurance policy deductible, they could qualify for a grant of up to \$20,000. Hurricane deductibles are larger than typical deductibles for home damages, and many people impacted do not have these funds readily available. Applications are to be completed online at CollierCountyHousing.com and grants will be available until funding is exhausted. Applicants must meet income limits up to 120% of the area median income (AMI). See chart below. In addition, residential value, according to the Collier County Appraiser, cannot exceed \$458,634.60.

Homeowners may also qualify to receive a deferred, interest-free loan up to \$50,000 to replace their roof. Applications must be picked up at the Collier County Community & Human Services Division located at the Collier County Government Complex, 3339 Tamiami Trail East, Building H, Suite 213 Naples, FL 34112. Applicants must qualify based on income and funds will be available until exhausted. Priority will be given to those with incomes below 50% AMI. See income table below. Other eligibility and documentation requirements include, but are not limited to:

- Must have owned primary residence for at least 12 months.
- Mortgage must be current and not have had more than one late payment in the past 12 months.
- Mobile/manufactured homes do not qualify.
- Proof of mortgage or deed, as well as legal residency or citizenship status and income will be required.
